## <u>Year 11</u>

Year 11 finished off their exam period admirably. As always, you get out what you put in, and this is very evident when pupils open their exam results envelope.

The Year 11s time with us was rounded off with their leavers' assembly and Prom. The leavers' assembly was packed with emotions, highlights and photos from over the years.
