

## DIGITAL INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

- This BTEC course is worth the equivalent of one GCSE grade 9 – 1.
- There will be an externally assessed unit that will complement the coursework.
- You learn by completing assignments that are based on realistic workplace situations and activities. Internal assessment is delivered through Pearson-set assignments. These assignments are set by Pearson and for each component new assignments are released twice a year. Pupils will be given a set time to complete these assignments.
- BTEC qualifications are recognised by employers and universities.

### **Component 1 – Exploring user interface design principles and project planning techniques**

This unit will allow learners to develop their understanding of what makes an effective user interface and how to effectively manage a project. They will use this understanding to plan, design and create their own user interface. Pupils will be able to:

- a) Understand interface design for individuals and organisations
- b) Use project planning techniques to plan, design and develop a user interface
- c) To review a user interface



### **Component 2 – Collecting, presenting and interpreting data**

This unit will allow learners to understand the characteristics of data and information and how they help organisations in decision making. Learners will use data manipulation methods to create a dashboard to present and draw conclusions from information. Pupils will be able to:

- a) Understand how data is collected and used by organisations and its impact on individuals
- b) Create a dashboard using data manipulation tools
- c) Draw conclusions and review data presentation methods

### **Component 3 – Effective digital working practices**

There is one external assessment, Component 3, which provides the main synoptic assessment for this unit. Component 3 builds directly on Component 1 and Component 2 and enables learning to be brought together and applied to a realistic context. Pupils will explore how organisations use digital systems and the wider implications associated with their use.
